2023 Highlights

This Year:

- Generated over \$11.7 million in estimated economic impact – the fourthbest output in park history.
- Surpassed the 3 million mark for park visitors (2008-23).
- Attracted all-time records for youth baseball teams (361) and youth fast-pitch teams (142) in City-coordinated tournaments.
- Surpassed \$160 million in estimated economic impact since 2008.
- Since 2008, visitor spending alone (\$67 million) has doubled the park construction cost (\$32.5 million).


Sports Park Welcomes 3-Millionth Visitor

City Tournaments Fuel Fourth-Best Economic Impact Year

Sparked by record-setting youth baseball and fastpitch tournament participation, Lithia & Driveway Fields generated over \$11.7 million in estimated economic impact in what was the fourth-best year for economic stimulus in the sports

park's 15-year history.

Managed and maintained by the City of Medford, Lithia & Driveway Fields surpassed the 3 million mark for park attendance dating back to May 6, 2008 when the five-five softball/baseball complex



The park's signature events

- the youth baseball tournaments

- remain white-hot in terms of demand and popularity. The 10 annual tourneys attracted an all-time-record 361 teams, with dozens more turned away due to capacity and a shortage of umpires.

After years of decline regionally and nationally, youth fastpitch soft-

ball tournament team counts surged past the 200-team mark (241) for the second straight year as a result of the City's partnership with northern California tournament powerhouse Legacy Sports, which resulted in 142 teams coming to four annu-

al tournaments, including 48 in the February "Bring It On" event.

Participation in adult slowpitch softball tournaments was strong except in the senior division. A grand total of 394 teams played in men's, women's, co-ed, and senior tournaments.

The largest tournament was the annual Rogue Me-

morial Challenge youth soccer tournament coordinated by the Rogue Valley Timbers over Memorial Day weekend, which, combined with the City's annual baseball tournament, produced a \$1.5 million weekend of economic impact, approximately 10% of the year's total.

Overall team count was 1,716 with 54 percent of teams being from Medford or the Rogue Valley.



More baseball teams played in Medford than ever before (361 in the 10 annual City-run tournaments).

About Lithia & Driveway Fields

Lithia & Driveway Fields (formerly U.S. Cellular Community Park), is a community park owned and operated by the City of Medford. The sports park is the largest municipal installation of FieldTurf in the United States with nearly 1.5 million square-feet of synthetic grass.

- The 5-field softball/baseball complex opened on May 9, 2008 and has hosted over 69,000 youth and adult games.
- The multi-sport complex opened in May 2009 and is the home of the Rogue Valley Timbers, Oregon's largest youth soccer club.
- U.S. Cellular paid \$650,000 for park naming-rights in 2005. At the time it was the largest naming-rights agreement for a municipal recreational facility in Oregon history.
- In 2021, Medford-based Lithia Motors and its subsidiary, Driveway, obtained park naming rights for a period of five years in an agreement valued at \$725,000.

Significance of the Economic Impact Report

In most communities, parks and recreation agencies are the engines of tourism and economic development. Recreational facilities like Lithia & Driveway Fields attract tourists, businesses and retirees, and enhance real estate values. A common mistake is to merely provide decision-makers with financial reports on the revenue and expenses of these facilities instead of illustrating economic impact and the broader value of the community's investment. Economic impact reports are estimates and are easily inflated.

Methodology and Data Collection

This study closely follows the economic impact data-collection and calculation methods set forth by Texas A&M researcher Dr. John L. Crompton in his landmark 1999 book, Measuring the Economic Impact.

Crompton contends only spending by visitors to Medford is meaningful in economic impact reports. Expenditures by tournament participants who reside in or near Medford are not included in Personal Income and Jobs calculations because of the likelihood their money would have been spent in the community on other forms of entertainment. The economic impact report also does not calculate the impact of participants in City-sponsored sports leagues that utilize the sports park.

The questionnaire used for this study generated spending data from tournament directors regarding approximate amounts each team spent on entry fees, food and beverages, entertainment, retail shopping, transportation expenses and lodging.

Conclusions

Total Spending: The park hosted 41 tournaments, events or contests that attracted 1,716 teams. These teams spent an estimated \$6,353,591 in hard dollars.

Visitor Spending: The 775 visiting teams spent almost \$4.5 million. Softball team size is estimated at 14; baseball, fastpitch teams and soccer is estimated at 18.

Sales: Total Spending by all tournament participants (local and visiting teams) multiplied by a "ripple effect" of 85 cents for every dollar spent, for a grand total of \$11,754,144. The 1.85 multiplier is based on Crompton studies of tournaments in a city of similar size.

Personal Income: This measure reports the direct, indirect and induced spending of visiting teams only. For every dollar spent by tournament visitors, 65 cents of personal income accrued within the community in the form of employee wages, salaries and proprietary income. Simply stated, the sports park theoretically generated \$32.54 for each Medford resident.

Jobs: If one job is created for every \$65,647 — Medford's median income — tournaments helped sustain nearly 90 jobs in the community based on the direct spending of visiting teams. The figure refers to both full- and part-time jobs, and it assumes the local economy is operating at full capacity and that there is no slack to absorb demand created by events.

Totals do not reflect impact of Harry & David Field.
